TRUTH: "...Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels" (Matthew 25:41). The Bible teaches us that many false teachers will be in the last days. TRUTH: "But there were false prophets also among the people, even as there shall be false teachers among you, who privily shall bring in damnable heresies, even denying the Lord that bought them, and bring upon themselves swift destruction" (2 Peter 2:1). The false teacher's message leads multitudes of people to believe that there are many ways to Heaven. Sad to say, they are deceived!
